




Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve vs. Junction Temperature






Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width





Fig.5 Avalanche Energy Derating






Fig.7 Typical Output Characteristics(I)





Fig.8 Typical Output Characteristics(II)





Fig.11 Static Drain - Source On - State


Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage

Fig.10 Normalized Gate Threshold . Voltage vs Junction Temperature






Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State

Fig.14 Typical Capacitance vs. Drain - Source Voltage




Fig.15 Typical Coss Stored Energy




Fig.16 Dynamic Input Characteristics





Fig.18 Reverse Recovery Time vs.

Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit





Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit



#### Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit




Fig.4-1 Diode Recovery Measurement Circuit







Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms




#### Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform



#### Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform




#### Fig.4-2 Diode Recovery Waveform




