




On-Resistance vs. Drain Current



Transconductance










Drain Source Breakdown vs. Junction Temperature




**Source Drain Diode Forward Voltage** 




On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

Safe Operating Area




Variance vs. Junction Temperature



Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Case




